Emergency Action Plan

Emergencies are never wanted, but they are a possibility, and so Brynmill and District Angling Club ensures that all our Authorised Bailiffs are familiar with appropriate emergency procedures. It must be appreciated that the waters are outdoor venues that have no alarm systems or equipment like fire extinguishers, neither is there a register or record of who is angling at any given time, anglers come and go as they please. Most emergencies can be resolved on the spot by removing the individuals from the situation. However in the event of a serious incident, which could arise from a death or injury caused by an accident, illness or threat, emergency services should be contacted and the following procedures followed:-

1. Secure safety of all individuals involved, stop all activities if safe, and remove all individuals from any danger or threat of danger. In the event of an individual falling in the the water, use of the the life belts that are situated at regular intervals around the lakes should be employed to assist the individual if required.
2. An Authorised Bailiff to attend if available and administer first aid if required, the First Aid Policy should be followed in this event. A record of any casualties state and anything administered to them to be made if possible
3. Emergency Services to be contacted if necessary by calling 999 if Fire, Police or Ambulance Services are required, or in the event of a chemical spillage call 0800 052 0130 to contact Welsh Waters emergency line. Callers contacting emergency services should provide the following information:
 - a. Nature of emergency
 - b. Location of the emergency
 - c. Your name and phone number from which they are calling.

In the event of a medical emergency the injured party should not be moved unless absolutely necessary. Wait for the emergency services to arrive.

4. Safety of any other anglers or members of the public will be maintained by removing them from scene of the incident.
5. Informing next of kin if required should be undertaken as soon as is practically possible.
6. An Incident/Accident Form should be completed as soon as is practically possible after the incident.

7. In the event that there is no Authorised Bailiffs or First Aiders available, the Designated Responsible Official should be contacted and they will arrange for an Authorised bailiff to attend as soon as possible.

8. Evacuation routes are via the main entrance lane to the Half Round Ponds, and via the main Car Park and roads surrounding the Fendrod Lake.
